On to Cilcain, we parked at the Water Works and walked up the valley, past the reservoirs onto the slopes of Moel Famau. Here we had our first Cuckoo with newly arrived Swifts overhead. We had close views of Willow Warblers joining the numerous Chiffchaffs.

A Treecreeper visited its nest site in an old oak tree with a handsome male Redstart singing in the branches overhead.

After lunch we drove to Cilcain, parking at the water works. As we began our walk towards Moel Famau we had a surprise encounter with a badger in full view in an open field across the stream. Continuing up the track past the reservoirs gave us Chiffchaff, Willow Warbler, Blackcap and Meadow Pipit, with a Cuckoo calling from the windy hillside.

Although our bird list was only 25 species we enjoyed the scenery, the flowers and the company.
