Lots of small birds, Goldcrests, Redpolls plus a large flock of Redwings and Fieldfares all on the way to a walk by the mere. On the Mere itself were nine Goosanders, six of which were males. Several of the Great Crested Grebes were paired up and doing the very dance for which they are famous. Water Rails called from the reedbed. Curlews were on the grassy bank across from the spit. A Little Egret and a male Goldeneye were amongst the highlights. Several Great Spotted Woodpeckers were heard and Nuthatches called. A Sparrowhawk was seen to flush many of the small birds.
